The Federal TRIO Programs (TRIO) are Federal outreach and student services programs designed to identify and provide services for individuals from low-income individuals, first-generation college students, and individuals with disabilities to progress through the academic pipeline from middle school to post baccalaureate programs.

At UIC, there are two TRIO programs: Student Support Services (SSS) Program and Upward Bound (UB). The Student Support Services Program offers academic coaching, tutorial services, career and graduate school exploration, study room support, and referrals to other services.

Upward Bound is designed to educate students to use the art of critical thinking, effective expression and a positive attitude so that they are able to negotiate the pursuit of higher education and a more satisfying future. The program offers programs such as cultural activities, mentoring and tutoring.
